

Playing in the Light: Godly Play/Faith & Play Training for Quakers

This powerful way of being with children can transform your First Day School or Friends school classroom, and nurture your own spiritual life. Learn and practice skills to help children explore the existential limits of their lives through wonder, play, and core stories from the Bible and Quaker faith and practice. These stories are scripted and tested to work well with multi-age groups of children, as well as in multi-generational settings. A certified trainer will model stories, and you will have an opportunity to practice them with your peers. Discussions and teaching modules include:

- exploring the spirituality of children
- considering the "unspoken" lessons of the teaching space and classroom structure
- supporting the circle of children and working with multiage groups and diverse needs
- weaving Godly Play/Faith & Play stories into a First Day School program with other religious educatino and spiritual nurture resources available

Workshop facilitator **Melinda Wenner Bradley**, a member of West Chester Friends Meeting (Philadelphia Yearly Meeting), is the clerk of the Faith & Play Working Group and an accredited Godly Play trainer who works with Quaker meetings and Friends schools around the country.

Quaker Voluntary Service is an 11-month experiment, living at the intersection of transformational spirituality and activism. Young adults work full-time in professional positions at community based organizations addressing a wide range of issues, while living in a cooperative house and worshiping with, and being mentored by, local Quakers. They receive housing, transportation, food, health insurance, and a small stipend, while engaging in regular self-led workshops and retreats that allow for continuing education in social justice, faith, and community building topics.

About the MLP Summer Conference

For some, activism is an expression of their spirituality. For others, activism is their form of spiritual practice. Union's Millennial Leaders Project (MLP) Summer Conference offers a structured space for millennial generation leaders, organizers and activists to examine the intersections of social justice and spirituality in their work and lives. Through a range of activities, the MLP Summer Conference aims to provide young leaders with an opportunity to look at their work in new ways, network and build relationships with leaders from across the country, and to develop resources to sustain their work over the long term. This conference builds upon Union's longstanding role as a leader in theological education, as well as the legacy of social justice activism that Union has fostered throughout its history. Ultimately, the MLP Summer Conference hopes to encourage and inspire conversations that build bridges and support organized movements that address the many forms of inequality in our world today.

From July 20-24, 2015, Union Theological Seminary will host 50 young leaders from around the United States for its second MLP Summer Conference. Applicants may be activists, organizers, NGO/NPO staff, in ordained or lay service to a local church or spiritual community, or they may serve in less official leadership roles as well. Applicants must be between the ages of 21-35 and have a demonstrated record of sustained social justice activism in their respective communities. Formal affiliation with a specific religious tradition or community is not a prerequisite, and people with no affiliation are encouraged to apply. In this regard, the only formal requirement is an interest in the intersections between spirituality and social justice.

Please note: Round-trip travel, shared room and board will be covered by the conference for all selected participants. Application Period begins on January 1, 2015 Application Deadline: Friday, February 27, 2015 (11:59pm EST)

YSOP's office in Washington, DC is looking for a great intern this summer! If you are currently enrolled as a full time college student, check out this fantastic opportunity.

Description:

YSOP engages young people in volunteer service to hungry and homeless people. Started by Quakers in 1983, YSOP has been a pioneer in service-learning. Last year 4,300 youth participated in YSOP programs, serving over 463,616 people in New York City and Washington, D.C. Our programs combine hands-on volunteer service with education on current issues and reflection on the service experience. YSOP hosts day-long, overnight and week-long service learning programs. YSOP welcomes individuals, public, independent and parochial schools, and community and religious youth groups.

Responsibilities:

The intern is involved with many aspects of our organization and must be able to multi-task, as he/she will execute a variety of responsibilities each day. The intern will serve as a liaison between YSOP and community partners and student groups. The intern will prepare materials for the arrival of volunteers, lead youth in service projects, and help facilitate group orientation and reflection activities. The intern will help maintain YSOP's online presence to support participant recruitment with electronic newsletters, networking websites, various social media outlets, and the YSOP website, www.ysop.org.

This is a full time (35 hour per week), 8 week position to take place during the months of June – August 2013. Some early mornings and evenings are required. YSOP is flexible regarding hours and start date.

Qualifications:

• The intern must be committed to promoting youth volunteerism and YSOP's mission.

- The intern must be organized and have good communication skills.
- The ability to work independently and as a team player is critical.
- Past service experience, working with youth, coordinating volunteers and facilitating reflective activities are advantageous.
- The candidate must returning to college in the Fall of 2015 as a full-time, undergraduate sophomore, junior or senior.


