Facebook Ads Outreach Experiment

In April of 2017, the Ministry Coordinating Committee approved a 50-Day Experiment for Facebook ads outreach to young adults. Interim Young Adult Field Secretary Emily Provance ran the ads in the areas of six monthly meetings, with clicks on the ads leading back to each local meeting's website. Within the first three weeks, the ads were seen by over 60,000 people between the ages of 18 and 40. How do Facebook ads work? Which types of ads proved to be most effective for outreach? Why Facebook rather than Twitter or Instagram? How can monthly meetings try this for themselves? What else can meetings do to make adsbased outreach as effective as possible?
