A threshing/listening session has been scheduled for Friday to allow for a discussion on how we can do what we want to do for the yearly meeting while overcoming the stumbling blocks in the way. The yearly meeting wants to hire a Youth and Young Adult Field Secretary, and we want to divest our investments from fossil fuels. However, there are financial implications for both of those projects. How should we move forward?

The use of a "consent agenda" was an experiment begun some years ago. Although it has been used successfully, and it has reduced the time needed for very full business agendas, it was never a process that was formalized or approved. As discussed in business at Spring Sessions 2019, we are proposing changes to make it clearer and more understandable, and to respond to requests for better timing, especially for nominations at summer sessions. The proposal is in the Seasoned Business Items List, formerly called "consent agenda", for the 2019 Summer Sessions, which Friends can read and review at any time. 
