

The NYYM Trustees would like to remind all about the Meeting Houses and Properties Fund. From the New York Yearly Meeting Trust Fund Descriptions, August 2018 Version: "This fund was established in 2017 at the direction of the Trustees. The proceeds from the sale of the Plattekill Meeting House were deposited in this fund. The income is directed to the Meeting Houses and Properties designated use fund. The income from the Brinkerhoff fund is also directed to the Meeting Houses and Properties Fund. Per the Trustees minutes of May 23, 2017....the approved uses of that Fund are expanded to include maintenance, repair and new construction of meetinghouses and properties."

The Committee to Revise Faith and Practice announces the release of the 2018 edition of Faith and Practice in two new formats through the Talking Books program of the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. For participants in the Talking Books program, there is both a downloadable version and a cartridge version that's played on a machine. The Talking Books program is a free service for people with low vision, blindness or a physical disability that prevents them from reading or holding a book. Certification by a physician, healthcare professional or librarian is required.
