New Quaker-Produced Video on War, the Environment, and Your Taxes

Members of the Friends Meeting at Cambridge (MA) community have produced a 28 minute video, "Peace and the Planet: War, the Environment, and Your Taxes," addressing the common bonds among environmentalists, peace activists, and advocates for economic justice. The video reviews the impact of war and preparations for war on the environment and on the availability of public funds for health, education, infrastructure repair, and other social needs. It is suitable for individual as well as group showings.


Peace and the Planet references the estimated million peace, justice, and environmental sustainability organizations world-wide. It discusses successful efforts at conflict resolution and the relatively new concept of *Just Peacemaking* as formulated by Jewish, Christian, and Muslim thinkers.

Therefore, our actual practices often reflect secular philosophies (constructs of people) and are not indicative of the spiritual faith we seek to live by, nor accepting of the extraordinary pluralistic society in which we depend upon for our freedom to worship as we please.
