Keeping Faith: Answering That of God in All Creation

We invite Friends to submit articles for the November *Spark* on the theme "Keeping Faith: Answering that of God in all creation," which was also our theme for the 2013 Summer Sessions.

"That of God"—most Friends know this phrase from George Fox's famous letter from Launceston jail, in which he wrote:

"This is the word of the Lord God to you all, a charge to you all in the presence of the living God; be patterns, be examples in all countries, places, islands, nations, wherever you come; that your life and conduct may preach among all sorts of people, and to them. Then you will come to walk cheerfully over the world, answering that of God in every one; whereby in them ye may be a blessing, and make the witness of God in them to bless you: then to the Lord God you shall be a sweet savour, and a blessing."

What if we expand "that of God" to include all creation?

Our speaker at Summer Sessions, Freida J. Jacques, Turtle Clan Clanmother of the Onondaga Nation of the Haudenosaunee, approached the theme through the lens of Indigenous people. Would you like to write an article about how you keep the faith? How you view that of God? Is it earthcare witness? Restorative justice? Social justice? Pastoral care? Ministry? Something else? Please **let us know right away** if you plan to submit an article.

They are put into holiday gift packages with donated toiletries and given out at a holiday party held at the Open Arms Shelter in White Plains.

Cornwall writes open letter to President Obama and elected officials on nonviolence

## TO PRESIDENT OBAMA AND OUR ELECTED REPRESENTATIVES:

We, members of Cornwall Monthly Meeting in New York, oppose U.S. military action in Syria.

As Quakers (Religious Society of Friends), we join many others who know that violence begets more violence; that history bears this out; that not only is nonviolent action the moral and ethical route, but also the practical one. "There is no way to peace; peace is the way."

This past week, we were reminded of the message of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., that words spoken in peace are heard and raise the possibility of change, but words spoken violently keep us from listening and changing. In the spirit of this historic event and the desperate need for these messages to prevail in these times, we urge our government to find the nonviolent route to responding to the Syrian government's use of chemical weapons.

In order to make it possible for our community to mourn all those who have been the victims of violent deaths, we will open our Meetinghouse, 60 Quaker Road, Cornwall, for worship and quiet meditation, from 10:30 to 7:30 on September 11, 2013.
