### **Yearly Meeting Ministry**

**NYYM** Friends participated in an enactment of the Two Row Wampum Treaty between the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) and the Dutch 400 years this vear. ago Friends Buffy Curtis and Liseli Haines paddled the Hudson

all the way from Albany to NYC, culminating in a UN event on Indigenous Peoples' rights. Roughly 75 other Friends paddled for shorter distances and provided support.

**Prison ministry.** Our prison ministry continues to flourish in 11 prison facilities. Friends are laboring with the NY Department of Corrections, which has so far denied a request from Friends in the Clinton prison facility for a worship group. *Breathing Space*, a place for formerly incarcerated people to reintegrate into society, is getting up and running.

**Nurturing ministry.** Friends' renewed focus on nurturing ministry throughout the Yearly Meeting continued this year. The Advancement Committee sponsored the fourth in its series of consultations, this one the second on ministry. The Spiritual Nurture Working Group conducted two events on being an elder and are

planning another for early 2014; they also are developing a spiritual formation program that will be organized regionally.



**New youth programs.** Fall Sessions 2013 featured programs for youth for the first time in a long while and we intend to continue this practice for Fall and Spring Sessions going forward.

**Meetings for Discernment.** These gatherings for extended worship continue to deeply enrich the spiritual life of the Yearly Meeting.

**Minutes of service.** The Yearly Meeting continues to give its support to Friends traveling abroad under minutes of service and witness:

- Nadine Hoover works to bring reconciliation to communities in Indonesia torn by violence.
- Judy Meikle has been traveling with a concern for the criminal justice system in the US.
- Rachel Pia travels as part of FGC's New Meetings Project.

- Several Friends work with the Bolivian Quaker Education Fund.
