


Meeting for Worship 11:00 a.m. Sunday

Worship

We meet for unprogrammed worship every Sunday (First Day) at 11:00 a.m. in the Library of Pitt Hall at Powell House. We gather in silent, expectant waiting to come into union with one another through the Spirit (communion).

There is no minister, pastor or priest. Each of us is called to listen for the movement of the Spirit within us. At times, a message may arise within one of us that is clearly intended to be shared with the group gathered. At such times that person will stand and speak. The meeting then continues in silent waiting. A message truly given will deepen the worship of those present.

At other times the full hour will pass with no vocal ministry given and yet participants will feel a sense of connection and fullness.

The meeting for worship closes with a handshake initiated by a member of Ministry and Counsel. Introductions and announcements are made followed by fellowship and refreshments.

Children

Children of all ages are welcome to participate in our faith community and our meeting for worship. Childcare is provided in the upstairs playroom for infants and toddlers. A First Day School class is held from 11:00 to

11:40 in the basement for school age children. Following the class, the children join in the remainder of the meeting for worship.

Teens

Activities

The Outreach, Peace and Justice committee of the Meeting offers a movie night the first Monday of the month from 7-9 p.m. that is free and open to the public. Light refreshments are served and a discussion period follows the film.

Meetings for Learning are held throughout the year. These are led by members of our community and reflect the passion and work of our members.

Quakerism classes are held periodically. These focus on the historical and contemporary writings about our faith and the practical application of our faith in our life.
